- 'Town after town' should be there in place of 'Towns after towns'
- If a **preposition** comes after a **noun** and the same **noun is repeated**, the noun should be used in singular form.

**Example:** Rows upon rows of marble looks beautiful. (wrong) Row upon row of marble looks beautiful. (right)

# Additional Information

• In such cases when the same noun is used after a preposition, we always use 'singular verb' as it will act as a singular subject.

**Example:** Ship after ship are arriving. (wrong) Ship after ship is arriving. (right)

Thus, the correct sentence is: Town after town was devastated.

- 'or an editor' should be there in place of 'or a editor'
- Since 'editor' is starting with a vowel sound 'an' should be used.





- Indefinite article 'A' is used before general, singular nouns that begin with a consonant sound. *Example: I saw a lion.*
- Indefinite article 'An' is used before general, singular nouns that begin with a vowel sound. *Example:* I saw an owl.
- Definite article 'The' is used before specific, known nouns, both singular and plural. *Example:* The lions were sleeping.

# Additional Information

- 'either..or', 'neither..nor', 'not only...but also' are the conjunctions that always occur in pair.
- When using a correlative conjunction, the words, phrases, or clauses following each part should be parallel.
   Faulty parallelism: It was both a long movie and poorly written.
   Correct parallelism: The movie was both long and poorly written.

Thus, the correct sentence is: He had no illusion of being either a distinguished writer or an editor.

The correct answer is **does not like me coming** 



- 'does not like my' should be there in place of 'does not like me'
- Possessive case of pronoun (my, our, your, his, their) comes before gerund.

  Example: I appreciate you taking the time to read our year-end report. (wrong)

  I appreciate your taking the time to read our year-end report. (right)



- I appreciate you taking time to talk with me about the project.

  The possessive case of *you* is not used with the gerund *taking*, so the writer ends up making the illogical statement (at least in this context) "I appreciate you."
- The point is not that the writer of the sentence appreciates you, per se; instead, the writer appreciates the fact that you took time to discuss the project. Thus, the correct sentence should be:

  I appreciate *your* taking time to talk with me about the project.

Thus, the correct sentence is: My mother does not like my coming late at night.

- 'me to help' should be there
- To 'want' is to feel or have a desire for. When saying 'Do you want me to' you're asking someone if there is anything you can do for them or assist them with.
- After the verb, we need an object, so 'objective case of the pronoun' should be there. So 'me' should be there.



• *Need, require,* and *want* can be **followed by** the active or passive *to*-infinitives to express active or passive meanings, respectively.

**Example:** I wanted to stay for a few more days.

It was obvious that he wanted to be invited.

• But active gerunds after these verbs express passive meanings:

**Example:** The windows want cleaning. (They should be cleaned.)

The complete sentence is: Do you want me to help you?

• If something or someone **astonishes** you, they surprise you very much.

**Example:** My news will astonish you.

• 'at' is used with adjectives to show the cause of something.

**Example:** They were impatient at the delay.

She was delighted at the result.

• 'of' is used after some adjectives before mentioning somebody/something that a feeling relates to.

**Example:** to be proud of something

• 'from' is used to show what the origin of somebody/something is.



- 'to' means to be directed towards; in connection with.
- Thus, 'at' is the most suitable option

Thus, the complete sentence is: He was astonished at his failure.

  - Since there is no object present 'said' will remain as it is.
- The conjunction 'that' is used in place of commas and inverted commas.
- The first person 'I' will be changed into 'he' and modal 'will' will be changed into 'would'.
- Change of time is also shown while changing to indirect speech so, 'now' will be changed into 'then'.

  - **Compellable** is an **adjective** which means (of a witness) able to be made to attend court or give evidence.
  - **Compulsion** is a **noun** that means the action or state of forcing or being forced to do something; constraint.
    - **Example:** The payment was made under compulsion
  - Compulsive is an adjective that means resulting from or relating to an irresistible urge. Example: compulsive eating
  - Compelled is the past tense and past participle form of 'compel'
- Thus, Compulsion is the correct answer.

  - Find the subject (People) and the object (him) of the sentence and exchange their places.
    - In passive 'him' is changed into 'he' (subjective case of pronoun)
  - Use preposition by before the agent (the people).
  - Use **helping verb** in the passive form according to the **tense** of the given sentence. (**Past Indefinite** was/were  $+ V_3$ )
- In the **present continuous/progressive** sentence following changes are made:



- Active: doer/agent + V<sub>2</sub> + Object
  - **Passive:** object + was/ were +  $V_3$  + by + agent/doer (made remains same in  $V_2$  and  $V_3$  form)
- At last line up the remaining part.

- Thus, battalion is wrongly spelt

  - Variety: the quality or state of being different or diverse; the absence of uniformity or monotony Example: It's the variety that makes my job so enjoyable.
  - **Purity:** freedom from adulteration or contamination **Example:** The purity of our drinking water
- Thus, 'anxiety' is the correct spelling.

- Q will be the last past of the sentence rearrangement as it concludes the sentence.
- Thus, the correct order will be **RPSQ**.





- Because is a subordinating conjunction, which means that it connects a subordinate clause to an independent clause.
  - For e.g.- Michael went to the forest **because** he loves walking among the trees.



- A **subordinate clause**, also known as a **dependent clause**, is a clause that cannot stand alone as a complete sentence; it merely complements a sentence's main clause, thereby adding to the whole unit of meaning.
  - For e.g.- We can all go for ice cream if I can find my wallet.

(Here, 'If' is the subordinate conjunction and the underlined part is the subordinate clause.)

**The correct sentence-** *Evergreen trees are a symbol of fertility because they do not die in the winter.*

- Meaning of other words:
  - Ancient: belonging to the very distant past and no longer in existence
  - **Humorous:** causing laughter and amusement; comic.
  - **Imaginary:** existing only in the imagination
- Thus, melodramatic is the synonym of 'histrionic'




